Ireland Referendum

A majority of the citizens of Ireland voted in favor of abortion in a referendum on 25 May 2018. They voted if favor ("Yes") of the 36th Amendment to approve elective abortion (below right), and change Article 40.3.3 of the *Constitution of Ireland* to remove "the right to life of the unborn" (left below). The vote was 1,429,981 "Yes" (66.4% of votes), and 723,632 "No." For the second time in history (after Portugal in 2007), the citizens of a nation (as opposed to a government or court decision) voted directly for the so-called "right" to kill their own children.

The Government of Ireland has drafted a new policy, the "Regulation of Termination of Pregnancy," which is being deliberated upon in Parliament, and which would approve:

- Aborting a baby "up to 12 weeks of pregnancy without specific indication";
- Aborting a baby if 2 doctors say there is a "risk to" mother's "physical or mental health";
- Aborting a baby if 1 doctor says there is a "risk of health" in an emergency;
- Aborting a baby anytime if 2 doctors think the baby may have a "fetal condition likely to lead to death before or shortly after birth or for maternal health" (Policy 1 to 9).
